HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Our college Santal Bidroha Sardha Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya reminds us about the great historical event of Santal Revolt which took place in 1855. The college is fittingly named after the revolt and was established in 2005. It is situated at Goaltore in the district of Paschim Medinipur, a place which is mainly inhabited by SC, ST and other Backward Class people. The college caters to the need of education and enlightenment to the students of the vast adjoining locality. The spontaneous donation and cooperation of the local people, the grants from the MLA, MP, Government of West Bengal and the very dynamic leadership of the Chairman, Center for Advancement of Higher Education, Midnapore have helped in the development of the college. At present the college offers 14 Honours and 19 General courses of study including seven well equipped laboratories. Many subjects have been introduced within a short span of ten years. Our achievement has really been incredible.



The college is affiliated to Vidyasagar University since its inception. From the very beginning the institution is trying to render qualitative education and arouse consciousness among the students in all spheres of life through different academic and co-curricular activities. The college has four units of National Service Scheme (NSS) running in full swing. It is worth mentioning that students of this college regularly represent Vidyasagar University at the State Level, Zonal and National Competitions with success. Goaltore is the headquarter of Garhbeta Block-II in Paschim Medinipur district of West Bengal. It is surrounded with all sides by abundant beauties of nature. The latitude in this area is 22°42'33'' N, longitude is 87°10'18''E, and altitude is 234 Feet. The dense forests, the rivulet, the green vegetation, the fascinating sights and sounds of nature really transport the inhabitants of the world of Utopia. Goaltore is like a capital of numerous villages within the radius of 20kms. Besides the college, Goaltore can boast of two High Schools (H.S.), B.D.O. office, a Block Health Centre, and three nationalized banks, two forest range offices, CRPF office and a few Govt. offices as well as a Police Station. What make Goaltore easily accessible are its communication facilities. It is like a junction where different roads are connected from distant places. There is a road that connects Sarenga from Chandrakona

Road via Goaltor. Buses on long routs are abundant. Trekkers are available in plenty connect the remote village even through impenetrable forests. As inevitable consequences of the same, students by and large, have become commuters and act against their higher studies at minimal expenses. To facilitate easy access to the college some link roads have been made and in course of time they have been transformed into bitumen roads. The main roads connecting Goaltore with Sarenga, Chandrakona Road and Midnapore have been broadened to evade hazards and congestion.

Duration of the Choice Based Credit System Course

The duration of the Programme is Six (06) consecutive semesters of six months each i. e., (03) three years and will start ordinarily in the month of July of each year. A candidate shall have to clear all the Semesters within consecutive five years from the academic year of his/her first admission to any college affiliated to Vidyasagar University failing which enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled.

Courses of Studies:

There shall be three courses of studies leading to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Degree and each course shall be of six semester duration. First shall be termed as B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Honours Degree Course; Second is B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. General Degree Course. Six semesters will be in three years. Odd semester (i.e. 1st, 3rd and 5th semester) is from July to December and even semester (i.e. 2nd, 4th and 6th semester) is from January to June.

Attendance:

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A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examination subject to the fulfillment of other conditions as laid down in the regulations. Such attendance will be calculated from the date of first appearance of the classes of a student.

Academic Year:

Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (Core, Elective or soft skill courses). Under the CBSS, the requirement for awarding Degree or diploma or certificates is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.

Credit Point:

It is the product of grade points and number of credits to be completed by the students.

Credit:

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A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/ field work per week.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a students' over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal points.

Grade Point:

It is a numerical grade allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.

Letter Grade:

It is an index of the performance of the students in a said course. Grade are denoted by letters 0,A+,A,B+,B,C,P and F.

Programme:

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P P P An educational programme leads to award of a Degree or Diploma or Certificate. xi. Semester: Each semester will consists of 15-18 weeks of academic year equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.

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It is a measure of performance of a student in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses of a semester and the course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal points.

Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate:

Based on the grade earned, a grade certificate shall be issued after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, marks, letter grade, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA and CGPA where applicable.

Dates of examination:

The examination for all the semesters will be held as per the prescribed academic calendar of every year. However, exact dates and the centers of examination shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations. Ordinarily, the university shall not deviate from the prescribed academic calendar. However, in the event of any unforeseen exigency the Controller of Examinations shall be competent for any minor adjustment in the schedule.

Eligibility criteria of examination and types of assessment:

- i) Each academic year shall have two Semesters. In each semester, there shall be two types of examinations: Internal Assessment (IA) and End Semester Examination (ESE).
- ii) In the semester system, the examinations will be held in six parts. The academic session including the examinations for first, third and fifth semester are July to December and that for second, fourth and sixth semester are January to June. Before the End Semester Examination, a student will enjoy study leave of 10-12 days.
- iii) A student must get himself/ herself admitted in each semester as per the admission rule. iv. A candidate shall be eligible for appearing at any of the semester of examination fulfilling the following essential condition: A student must have at least 75% class attendance (theory and practical separately). Student must complete internal assessment.

Hour of End Semester Examination:

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- a) Honours/General theoretical papers of full marks up to 50, duration 2 hours.
- b) Honours/General theoretical papers of full marks more than 50, duration 3 hours.
- c) Honours/General practical papers of full marks up to 50, duration 3 hours.
- d) Honours/General practical papers of full marks above 50, duration 5 hour.

A candidate (Honours/ General) shall have to complete each semester examination within 3 (Three) consecutive chances including his / her first appearance in the concerned End Semester Examination. If a candidate does not avail of any chance/chances mentioned above within the stipulated period, the chance shall be deemed to have lapsed. A student failing to get pass in one or more course(s) in respective semester examination, he/she may re-appear at the following year as 2nd chance. A student will be permitted to clear his/her failed course(s) in maximum three consecutive chances irrespective of availing/ not availing any particular chances. Student who skips semester examination will be eligible to clear those course(s) in the respective semester of subsequent years (i.e. 1st semester with the 1st semester of the subsequent year, 2nd semester with the 2nd semester of the subsequent year) and so on. If any candidate fails to qualify any

6. INSTITUTE VISIT

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

11. Disciplinary Committee


A Disciplinary committee keeps a special look out for discipline in the college. Any act of indiscipline is strictly dealt with by this committee.

15. Extra Curricular Activities

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

It includes dates of academic events like college examination and probable dates of university examination, publication of college results, parent-teacher meeting and schedules of form-fill up as well as extra-curricular activities and competitions organised by the College.

20. Information Regarding Syllabus

At the beginning of each academic session, syllabus of each subject to be taught, both in Honours and Generic courses, along with module distribution is notified to the students by the respective departments.

21. Compulsory Excursions

As per rule of the Vidyasagar University Botany, Zoology and Psychology, Geography Bengali Departments are required to take their students on excursions related to academic projects in their respective areas. Students studying these subjects at the Honours level are required to participate in these excursions. The place of excursion is decided each year by the department concerned. The charges of excursions are to be paid by the students separately. At least one faculty member accompanies the students on excursions.

Besides the compulsory excursions, other departments also organise educational trips and excursions to places of historical and cultural significance, both near and far. Students are also taken to various symposium, seminars and workshops, research institutes and exhibitions pertaining to their subjects of study.



23. Library

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SBSS Mahavidyalaya Library is quite large with approximately 1, 10,000 books, including huge number of rare and old books. The number of books in the library is on the increase owing to further annual purchases, keeping in view the changes brought about in various subjects and the needs of the students.



Some Salient Features of the Library

- Library is fully computerized

- Access to INFLIBNET for downloading e-books and journal papers, both within campus and outside.
- Open Access to books available.
- The Library is under CCTV surveillance.

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1. Students are not entitled to receive books from the Library without ID cards.

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2. The books are for the use of the staff and students of the college only. The borrower will be responsible for the books so long as the receipt remains with the Librarian. Books must not be passed on to another reader.

3. Books issued by the teaching-staff may be recalled and must be returned at once on receipt of a notice from the librarian.

4. Books required but cannot be borrowed for some reason can be used in the Reading Room only.

5. Books lost, damaged, or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If such a book is one of a series and is not available singly, the whole set must be replaced by the borrower.

6. If the lost book is not available, the borrower will have to pay a fine to be determined by the Principal in addition to the price of the book. The borrower will lose the right to use the library till the loss is made up.

7. Students will be provided with two Home issue and one Day Issue card in general.

8. The borrower's card is returnable at the end of the session and is strictly non transferable.

9. Students leaving the College for the University Examinations must return the library books and the cards and get a clearance certificate from the Librarian before receiving admit cards for B.A. / B.Sc. semester, Part II and Part III examinations.

10. The loss of membership cards should be immediately reported to the Librarian. A fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged for a fresh card.

11. The non-teaching staff can borrow five books at a time.

12. The day issue books must be returned by 4.PM. on the same day without fail. The defaulter's card will be detained for three days from the date of issue.

13. Day-issue of books is closed on Saturdays.

14. Books must be returned within a fortnight of the date of issue. Defaulters will have to pay a fine of fifty paise per day per book and will lose the right to borrow books till the fine is paid.

15. Members of the teaching staff may retain books for three months and the non-teaching staff for a fortnight.

16. All books must be returned to the Library at the end of the collegiate year. Specific date limit for the return of the books is issued after the Annual/Semester Examinations.

Department of Physical Education





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
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Department of Botany


