## HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Our Santal Bidroha Sardha Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya reminds us about the great historical event of Santal Revolt that took place in 1855. The college is fittingly named as it was established on August 1st, 2005. It is situated at Goaltore in the district of Paschim Medinipur, a place which is mainly inhabited by ST, SC and Other Backward Class people. The College has rendered a tremendous boost to the students of the vast locality. Goaltore is the head quarter of Garhbeta Block-II in Paschim Medinipur district of West Bengal. It is surrounded by abundant beauties of nature. The dense forests, the rivulet, the green vegetation, the fascinating sights and sounds of nature really transport the inhabitants to the world of Utopia. Goaltore is like the capital of numerous villages within a radius of 20 Km. It is the centre of a good number of feeder schools and also the educational capital of the Jangalmahal. The institution thus brings the burning light to the backward classes. The college also aims at empowering the underprivileged section of the society by imparting quality education to rural people, particularly the women, poor and backward classes. Within the framework of University prescribed curricula, the potentiality for increasing human resource within the locality is encouraged through the Upanishadic teachings and ideals of Rabindranath Tagore, Mahatma Gandhi, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, and Swami Vivekananda.

At present the college offers 14 Honours and 19 General courses of study including well equipped laboratories. Many subjects have been introduced within a short span of ten years. Our achievement has really been incredible. The college is affiliated to Vidyasagar University since its inception 2005. The College is recognized under section 2 (f) vide its letter no. 8-275/2013 (Cpp-t/C), Dated: 27/08/2023 and also 12B on 07/11/2013. From the very beginning the institution is trying to render qualitative education and arouse consciousness among the students in all spheres of life through different academic and co-curricular activities. The college has four units of National Service Scheme (NSS) running in full swing. It is worth mentioning that students of this college regularly represent Vidyasagar University at the State Level, Zonal and National Competitions with success.

Santal Bidroha Sardha Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya was accredited by NAAC with Grade B+ on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2017. During the last few years after the completion of Cycle I accreditation by the NAAC, Santal Bidroha Sardha Satabarshiki Mahavidyalaya has made substantial progress both in qualitative as well as quantitative terms in providing quality education. The College introduced B.Sc Honours in Physics as a subject in 2019, B.A Honours in Education as a subject in 2019, B.Sc General in Computer Science in 2019, B.Sc General in Anthropology in 2019 and BA MULTIDISCIPLINARY COURSE (AL-CHIKI SCRIPT) in 2023.

- To create enough infrastructural facility for Multidisciplinary courses as mentioned by the University guideline

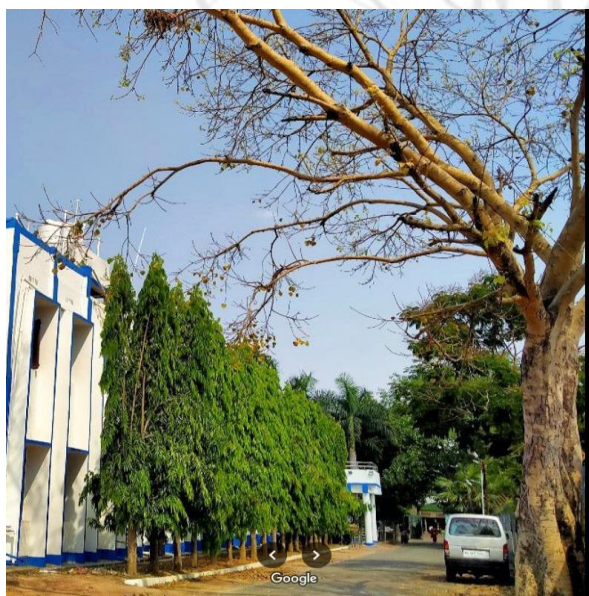

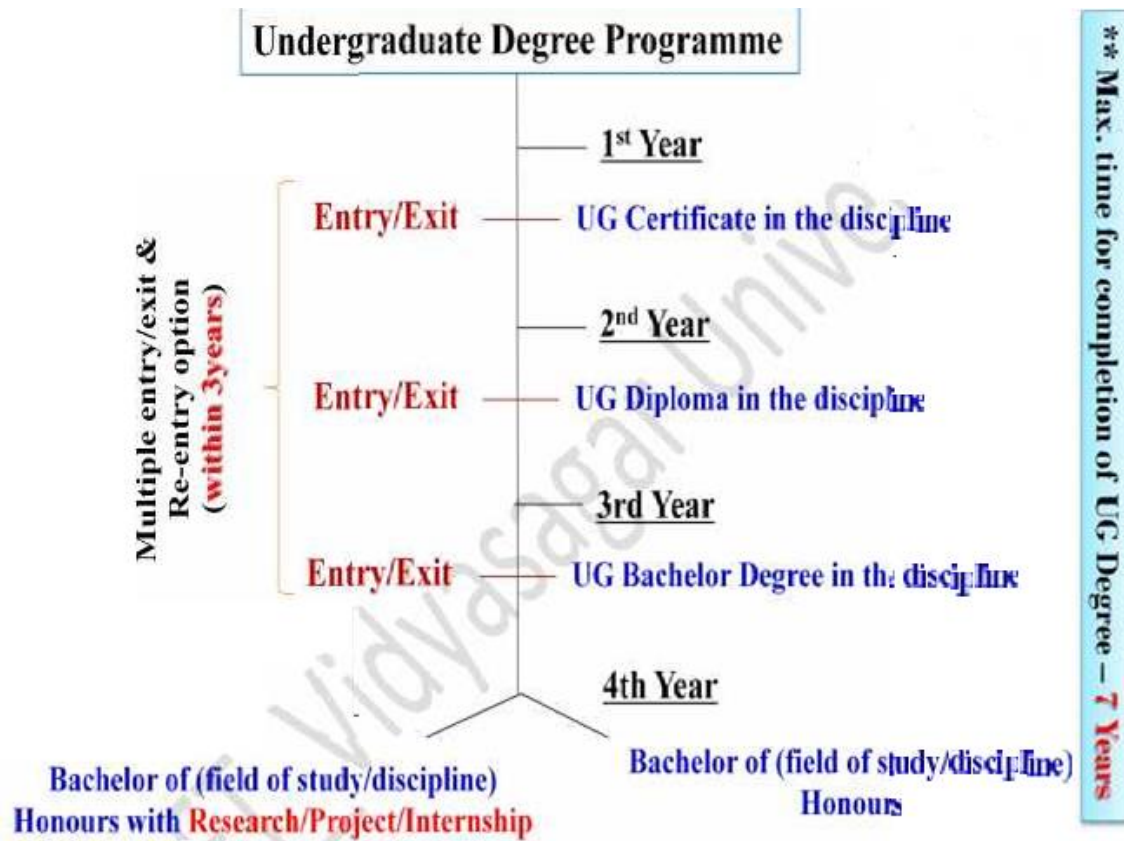
## *National Education Policy, 2020*

**(w.e.f Academic Session 2023-24)**

### **1. Preamble**

- The Govt. of India notified National Education Policy (NEP) on 29 July,2020 and subsequently UGC developed *Curriculum & Credit Framework for UG Programmes (CCFUP)* based on NEP and it forwarded to all Universities in January, 2023.
- Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal issued directives for implementation of CCFUP on 17 March, 2023 to all State Universities from the forthcoming session.
- The Vidyasagar University, in concurrence with the academic and administrative restructuring recommended in CCFUP, has designed new Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in Semester mode for various disciplines and recommended for its implementation from the Academic Session 2023-24.
- The new Curriculum based on CCFUP has emphasized on continuous learning and evaluation, holistic education by allowing students to experience inter/multidisciplinary and Value Added courses through a 3-Year or 4-Year Undergraduate programmes with flexible degree having multiple entry and exit options.
- The student is provided abundant opportunities during the programme of study to accumulate credits by opting for Major Courses, Minor Courses, Multidisciplinary Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses and Value Added Courses under various disciplines. Students will choose major, minor, multidisciplinary and other courses at the time of their admission. This system aims to strengthen the academic potential of the student as it provides flexibility in the choice of courses offered beyond the framework of the respective disciplines of study.
- The 4- year under graduate programmes under Vidyasagar University based on CCFUP structures have been designed in the disciplines of Science, Arts, Commerce as well as professional studies.

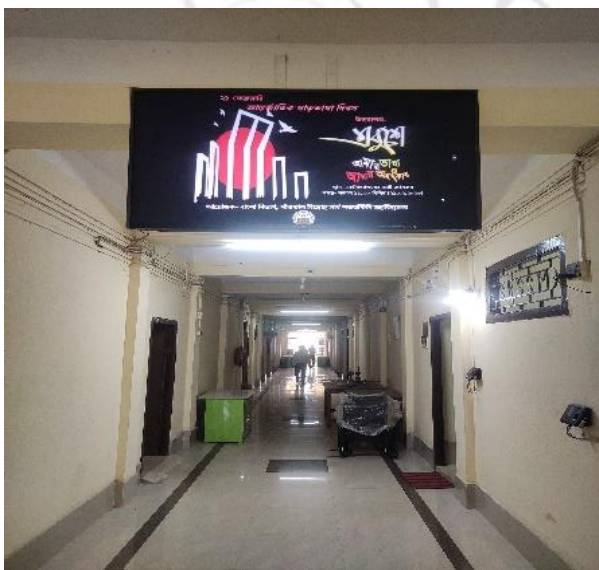

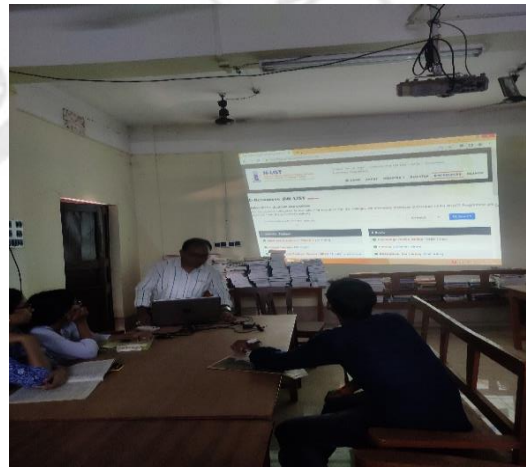
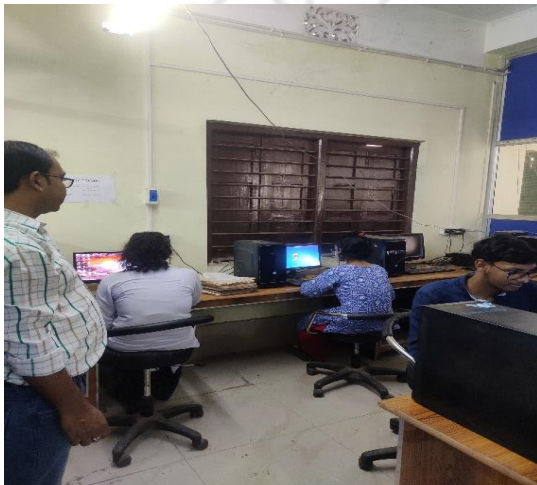

The NSS Units are very much enthusiastic in observing all programmes as per the instructions and guidelines provided by the affiliating university (Vidyasagar University) in time.

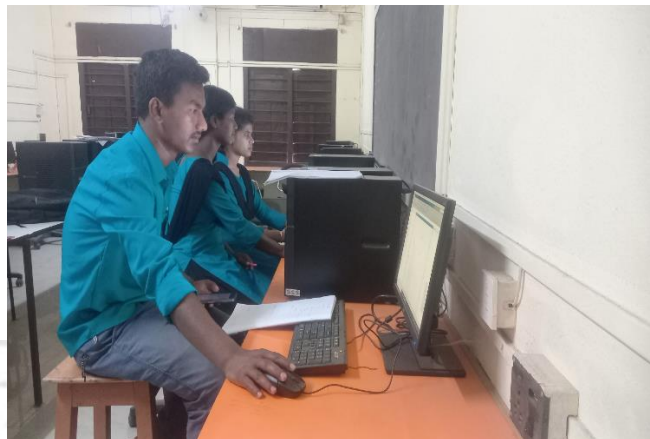

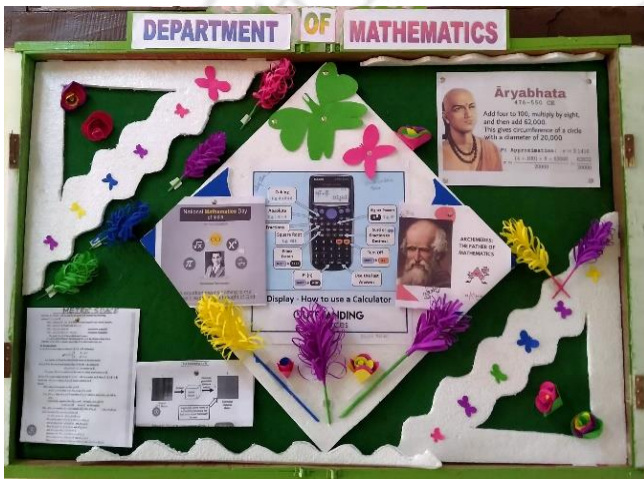
